DIOCESE OF FALL RIVER LENTEN REGULATIONS 2010

- 1. LAW OF FAST**
A. All adults (18 and older) are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their 60th year.
B. On days of fast, those bound by the law are limited to a single full meal. This meal is meatless. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs; however, together these two meals should not equal another full meal.
C. There are two prescribed days of fast: **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**.
- 2. LAW OF ABSTINENCE**
A. Those who are 14 years of age and older are obliged to observe the law of abstinence.
B. On days of abstinence, those bound by the law abstain from meat.
C. On all **Fridays of Lent**, abstinence is prescribed. This, of course, includes **Good Friday**. Abstinence is also prescribed on **Ash Wednesday**.

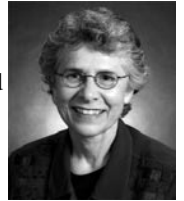

End of Life Issues

When discussing a “Living Will” (which documents your right to accept or refuse certain medical treatments) or “Durable Power of Attorney” (which grants authority to a person you designate to act as proxy if you are unable to speak yourself), the expression “quality of life” should be avoided. This term is used by advocates of euthanasia and assisted suicide to justify these methods of ending life presuming that they are merciful as the pain of terminal illness is too much to bear. “While illness and other circumstances can make life difficult, they cannot diminish the inestimable worth of each human life created by God. Life is always a good and is a quality that can never be lost.”

Lenten Messages from Jesus

Throughout 4 weeks of Lent, we will see how Jesus takes the accepted beliefs of his day and stands them on their heads. **He names four groups of people who would have been regarded as very blest, and states that they are anything but blest.** And he takes four groups who would have been regarded as cursed and pronounced them blest. Jesus is speaking to a situation in which the economically poor are reduced to begging – they are marginalized. The rich and better-off members of the community fail in their covenant with God by not coming to the rescue of the poor. When this happens, God sides with the poor and speaks on their behalf.

**Blessed are the poor
... and woe to the rich.**

The poor are not blest because they are materially destitute; rather, they are blest because they are able to place their trust in God in the midst of poverty. They are blest because God is on their side. The rich are not cursed simply because they are materially well off, but because of their failure to come to the rescue of the poor by generously sharing their blessings with them. They are having their reward **now** but they will lose out big time in the reign of God.
