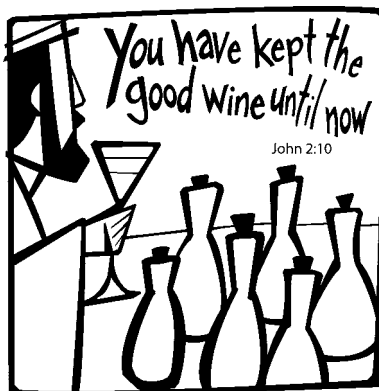

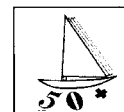

January Book Practicing Catholic

James Carroll

Biography of American Belief

In **Practicing Catholic**, James Carroll brilliantly shows how Roman Catholic struggles illuminate spiritual quests in all faiths. This book has the form of a personal and historical essay about the Catholic Church in his lifetime – from the full flower of medieval Catholicism through the heady arrival of an Irish-American subculture in the Kennedy era, the glorious witness of a humanist pope, John XXIII, the frightening era of assigination and war, the crisis of authority over sexual morality, the ironic collapse of post-Vatican II Catholic identity after the betrayal of the priestly sexual-abuse scandal. In the telling of his story, Carroll discovers that the most important personal note is gratitude for the way in which the Catholic tradition presents itself anew, inviting a fresh embrace and affirming a place of welcome.

Pro Life

It is 37 years since the legalization of abortion by the Supreme Court decision, *Roe v. Wade*. This decision damaged our constitutional and social order, because, as Wanda Franz, president of National Right to Life states, "the 'unalienable Right' to life is no longer 'endowed by the Creator' but dependent on someone else's moods and feelings. Under this peculiar principle, one and the same unborn child could be a 'baby' in the eyes of one parent and a 'fetus' to be aborted in the eyes of the other."
